Dallas Love Field's New Liquid Collection Station at TSA

As part of our efforts to enhance the passenger experience and promote environmental sustainability, the Department of Aviation launched a new Liquid Collection Station at Dallas Love Field Airport. The station will allow passengers to empty and recycle their bottles before entering the TSA Security Checkpoint. During a recent waste audit, the DOA's Environmental Division found that more than 60% (by weight) of total waste in the TSA zone was liquid. This liquid contaminates other recyclable material, meaning the material is no longer recyclable. By launching the Liquid Collection Station, Love Field will be able to reduce the airport's total waste and ensure recycled material is disposed of properly.







Dallas Love Field Earned Airport Carbon Accreditation Level 2:

In November 2018, Airports Council International announced that Dallas Love Field earned Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) Level 2 due to the airport's



efforts to reduce its carbon footprint. Love Field earned this accreditation by reducing its carbon emissions in 2017 compared to the average of 2015 and 2016 emissions levels. In addition, the Department of Aviation developed a comprehensive Carbon Management Plan that outlines efforts to reduce the airport's greenhouse gas emissions and identifies how future emissions will be reduced. Department of Aviation staff, Sana Drissi, Khurram Qadri, and Clifford York, accepted the ACA Level 2 Award at this September's Airports Council International – North America Annual Conference. The Department of Aviation is currently pursuing the renewal of ACA Level 2.





Water Bottle Refill Stations


Love Field added water bottle refilling stations throughout the terminal, giving customers an opportunity to fill their own bottles and send less plastic to the recycling center.

In recent years, airports throughout the country have added these stations based on customer demand. The stations annually save tens of thousands of water bottles from being used. DAL placed three on the secured portion of the terminal (down each gate wing and in the stem) and one on the non-secure side, near baggage claim.

DAL Ranks Second in JD Power North American Airport Satisfaction Study

For the second-straight year, Dallas Love Field ranked No. 2 among large airports in the J.D. Power North America Airport Satisfaction Study, it was announced Wednesday, September 25, 2019.

Six key areas for overall passenger satisfaction were the focus of the study – terminal facilities; airport accessibility; security check; baggage claim; check-in and food, beverage and retail.

The study defined large airports as those who serve between 10 million to 32.9 million total passengers and was based on a survey of more than 32,000 travelers from October 2018 to September 2019.


Love Field's score improved 16 points from last year, checking in at 826 on the 1,000-point scale. DAL was one of three airports in the large category to earn five JDPower.com Power Circles, defining it as among the best.

The large airport average score was 765 and the overall North American airport score was 762. DAL's 826 points ranked fifth among all airports, regardless of size.

Love Field has consistently performed well in the J.D. Power North American Airport Satisfaction Study, including earning the top spot among medium airports in 2015. DAL moved to the large category in 2017 and was ranked third, before its second-place ranking a year ago.
