Good Neighbor Program Goals


Some of our goals in being a good neighbor include giving the community:





Lemmon Avenue Streetscape Enhancements







- 100% design complete for Trail and Streetscape enhancements; FAA coordination continues
- Estimated construction start Summer 2023
- 12 ft. mixed-use with 10' in areas with right-of-way constraints with enhanced pedestrian crossings connecting to the Bachman Lake Trail system
- Main Gateway feature at Lemmon Avenue/Airdrome Drive triangle and two (2) secondary gateway features at Lovers Lane and Shorecrest Drive
- Project limits extended to Airdrome Drive and Mockingbird Lane (@ Collville Avenue)



Cross-Field Taxiways



PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project will include the construction of Crossfield Taxiways and connecting taxiways, it will also include the construction of the proposed Remain Over Night (RONs), deicing areas, analyze the location of the run-up area and recommend relocation/reconfiguration.

- Access to the airfield will be from a temporary gate in the existing AOA fence
- Construction access to the site is via the VSR
- This access route will keep construction traffic confined to the site


PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Noise Stakeholders Meeting

- The Department of Aviation is currently hosting a series of noise stakeholder meetings to review the Voluntary Noise Program (VNP) by discussing DAL's current program and provide feasible noise measures to the FAA for their review and implementation.
- Goal to provide information on aircraft noise, the opportunity to review the existing program, and suggest new/modified feasible noise mitigating measures.
- Stakeholders consist of a third-party Facilitator, Consultants (HMMH), Federal Government (FAA), Department of Aviation Staff, Airline representatives, Airport tenants, School representatives, Neighborhood Associations, and Individual Residents.





• Q. Upcoming forecast schedule of projects and capital improvement program.

A. See Slide # 17.

- Q. Currently, Patrick Carreno is named as Interim Director of Aviation. What are the long-term plans for this leadership position? If an executive search is planned what is the anticipated time frame to name, the Director?
 - A. In the next few weeks, the City Manager's Office will begin the official recruitment process for a permanent placement as the Director of Aviation.
- Q. How will the recent SWA cancelled flight problem and subsequent cost of passenger reimbursement and employee compensation affect operations and/or planned infrastructure projects at Love Field, where SWA accounts for 95%+ of flights?
 - A. There will not be a long-term impact on DAL's development budget. We have safeguards to protect the airport in our lease agreement.



- Q. I live in the Bluffview area, and we have noticed a massive uptick in the aviation noise since the holidays. We have always heard the planes flying in the background and occasionally a very loud plane but now it sounds as if the planes are flying over our houses every five minutes and can feel the noise shaking the house. Has something changed with the flight plans?
 - A. In response to your question, there have not been any changes to flight paths here at Dallas Love Field Airport (DAL). As you may have heard, there has been flight delays/cancellations over the holiday travel period which resulted in residents experiencing aircraft noise at different hours and frequencies. These delays/ cancellations extended into the first week of January, but as of this week using our Noise and Operations Monitoring System (NOMS) we are no longer seeing these abnormalities.

DAL is part of a much larger and complex airspace system, therefore movement of aircraft within the DFW metroplex are coordinated by Air Traffic Control (ATC) to ensure the safe and expeditious flow of aircraft. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) established air traffic routes throughout the Metroplex, to safely separate aircraft, both horizontally and vertically.



 Q. I want to know what is going to be done to reduce the noise pollution over the Bluffview and Briarwood neighborhoods. I have been asking this question for 18 months and have not gotten any response except that it is caused by the runway construction. The runway is done but the noise continues. Something must be done!
